Upgrade Your Lawn & Garden Equipment and Save!

To offset costs of new electric lawn and garden equipment, the City of Irvine has partnered with South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) to offer rebates for Irvine residents who switch from gas-powered to electric equipment.

Follow These 3 Easy Steps!

Purchase New/Factory Reconditioned Electric Lawn & Garden Equipment

- Choose a brand-new cordless electric lawn mower, chainsaw, leaf blower, or hand-held trimmer (includes edgers, weed wackers, brushcutters) and purchase it from an authorized retail store or online. To apply, please visit aqmd.gov/lawnmower and upload the purchase receipt(s) of your new lawn mower, chainsaw, leaf blower, or trimmer.

Recycle Your Old Gas Lawn Equipment

- Select a certified scrapper from the list of scappers on the AQMD website. You will receive an email with your Dismantler Verification Form and a printed copy of the form. Take your old operational gas-powered lawn and garden equipment to the selected scrapping location. Have the scrapper stamp, sign, and return the Dismantler Verification Form to you.

Apply for Your Rebate (up to \$250)

- Upload the signed Dismantler Verification Form to your application. Sign and submit your final application electronically for processing.

Rules and Conditions Apply: Rebate cannot be greater than purchase price, not including taxes and delivery. Each participant can receive a maximum of 3 rebates for the lifetime of the program. Program is on a first-come, first-served basis until funds run out. Each electric lawn garden equipment purchased must be cordless and include a battery and charger. You must scrap an operational and equivalent lawn and garden equipment for each electric equipment to receive the rebate.
